So, there's a chance the plates will *never* be on the market again after January 13th.



Winners do have the option to sell their plates to someone else, which they can do since all auction plates are fully transferable, unlike other Texas license plates.

The Great Plate Auction January 13 at Cowboys Stadium is the first time license plates have been legally auctioned in Texas. Since no one has done this before in our state, we're excited to see how Texans will have fun with this event.

My Plates will auction 7-character messages including RANGERS, COWBOYS, FT WORTH, PORSCHE and FERRARI. See the full list above.

If you haven't already, register to bid at www.myplates.com/auction. You may register online until noon today, Wednesday, January 12th. My Plates will also accept bidder registrations at the event, for those who may miss the online option.

In the world of personalized license plates, reaching 7 characters is a big deal. It's an especially big deal in Texas because personalized plates have been limited to a maximum of 6-characters since 1965.

Also at the Great Plate Auction, My Plates will announce the date that 7-character personalized plates will be available to order at www.myplates.com. So far, more than 2000 Texans have already registered interest in 7-character plates and have been waiting to hear that date.

All plate messages are subject to approval by the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles.

Texans have bought more than 33,000 My Plates since November 2009, putting more than \$2.6M in the state general revenue fund.
